- **PH + US Coverage:** Spot on – your Philippine DL handles local needs, and the US one (with temp proof) covers any stateside trips or ID requirements (e.g., REAL ID compliant if your old one was).

If You Want It Faster (Optional, No Pressure)

- **Quick Retry Tomorrow Morning:** Hit the public check tool first:
<https://mydmvportal.flhsmv.gov/home/en/publicweb/dlcheck/> (enter new DL # + DOB) – it often generates the PDF instantly by then.
- **Email Request (1-2 Days):** If still no luck, submit here for them to email it: https://flhsmv.service-now.com/csp?id=flhsmv_csp_dl_index > "Driver License/ID Card" > "Temporary Driving Permit" (use Confirmation ID 244427306). Super easy for out-of-state folks like you.

- **Call for Instant (If Impatient):** 850-617-2000 – they'll email it in 10 mins (mention senior/out-of-country for priority).

I have a brokerage account, and I'm not going to buy crypto so, I'll wait
